Dear Mrs. Holm,

I thank you for your letter
of 31-10-88 and I regret the delay in ^{replying} replying,
but this has been unavoidable.

I shall make this letter a ^{fairly} fairly
short reply and write you again when I have
searched for documents, relating to my arrival
in Sweden on the night 29/30 August 1944. I have
some relevant details put away somewhere, and only
hope that I can find them

I can confirm that I was at Nepal
on 75 N.I. Squadron, and can still remember,
very vividly just what happened. There is
no doubt in my mind that we were attacked
by a German night-fighter whilst flying over
Sweden, so although there were many anti-aircraft

guns firing at us, I feel quite sure that night
 fighters picked us up as we flew over Denmark
 and one of them picked our aircraft out
 for destruction. We were hit ~~by~~ several
 cannon shells, and Sgt. Kawsley was killed at
 this time, and ~~not~~ ^{infe} ^{over} ^{Tyskland} over Germany as this was
 the only attack we ^{utstod} suffered. I would ^{bekräfta} confirm
 that we never reached the target of Stettin.

I was informed during my stay in Sweden,
 that 8 Lancasters were shot down ~~over~~ that night
 over South Sweden, but you probably know
 more about that, than I do.

I do have some newspaper cuttings
 relating to the burial of 22 allied ^{flygare} airmen
 at PÅLSSO cemetery, which is I believe near
 Hålsingborg. I cannot say which newspaper it
 was, but I expect you have ^{tillgång} access to many
 newspaper files which refer to this funeral.

I will finish now and get this letter posted
 and perhaps you would let me know if you would
 like more detailed ^{Frednings} accounts, ^{Direktör}
